Personal interest: -

Councillors have to disclose and withdraw if the following applies -

- Employment carried out for profit or gain
- Employers, partnership or remunerated directorships
- Any person paying their election expenses
- Any corporate body that has a place of business or land in the council's area in which the councillor has a substantial financial interest

Councillors also have a personal interest and must withdraw if a matter relates to an organisation of which they are a member (or in the position of control or management) including

- Private clubs
- Pressure groups, trade unions or professional bodies
- Other charitable bodies

Please note

The requirement to withdraw also applies to any other personal interest where a member of the public might reasonably conclude that the councillor's ability to act purely on the merits of the case and in the public interest might be affected.

Councillors have a personal interest in a decision if they think that it might benefit or disadvantage themselves, family, friends or close associates to a great extent than other in the area. This included anybody where they work or have a position of ownership, control or management.

Councillors have a personal interest and may speak (but not vote) if the matter relates to

- Another relevant authority of which they are a member
- An organisation where they hold a position of control or management
- An organisation where they are the council's representative

Pecuniary (or financial) interest

Councillors who have a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in a matter, (especially the relevance of contracts, much disclose the interest as soon as they can after the start of the meeting. They must not take part in the discussion nor vote on the matter, but they do not have to withdraw
